rom coast to coast, Canada is filled with unexpected wonders that are sure to awaken your inner explorer. If you are an avid wild life lover or appreciate nature Canada can offer you ample choices.

Sea Otters: Beautiful marine life

Province/Territory: British Columbia (Remote corner of Vancouver)

You can explore this remote corner of Vancouver island by kayak. Here you can witness sea otters and 110 hectares of old growth rainforest on rugged Spring Island. Dipping your paddle into the gentle swell, you glide through a jungle of enormous floating sea kelp toward an armada of bobbing, furry heads. Suddenly, its formation is broken by a playful splash of a sea otter diving beneath the glassy waters. You are kayaking off the outermost western edge of Vancouver Island along a wild, wave sculpted coastline of ancient forests and windswept beaches.

Out here, sea caves and vertical rock stacks shape nearby shores. Enormous thousand

a playful splash of a sea otter diving beneath the glassy waters. You are kayaking off the outermost western edge of Vancouver Island along a wild, wave sculpted coastline of ancient forests and windswept beaches.

year old cedars and Sitka spruce stand covered with ferns, moss and lichen. Hidden inlets and freshwater streams beckon. And a black bear lumbers along a deserted beach searching for crabs.

Home-base is a camp of comfortable beds, spacious tents and gourmet temptations on

Spring Island, 150 kms northwest of Tofino, surrounded by the Kyuquot Sound. This is the traditional territory of the Kyuquot and Checleset First Nations, who share an Aboriginal salmon feast with you around the fire while the sea otters play offshore.

- Circumnavigate the rocky outline of remote Spring Island in search of playful sea otters, eagles, puffins, seals, snorting sea lions, and maybe even a whale or two.
- Savour a morning cappuccino at your luxurious base camp before launching into a protected bay.
- Learn to identify sea anemones, periwinkle, sea stars, gooseneck barnacles and other marine life.
- Land your expedition kayak on a black sand beach for a delicious lunch of guacamole, black bean and corn salad.
- Watch massive bull kelp twist on ocean currents and iridescent seaweed shimmer on cobalt waters.
- Learn about the unique biology of the sea otter in the protected sea mammal sanctuary.
- View black bears from kayaks while they

forage along the shoreline.

- Hike through enchanting arboreal worlds and learn their botanical secrets from local guides
- Eat a traditional salmon dinner prepared around the fire - and visit with local First Nations elder family.
- Enjoy unfamiliar camping comforts, including beds, prepared meals, a shower, and space to roam without crashing waves, bears and cougars.

Weather

- This part of Vancouver Island is a temperate rainforest, receiving significant rainfall







he gastronomic meal of the French has been inscribed on the UNESCO 'list of Intangible Cultural heritage of humanity', so if you are a foodie couple and love visiting gorgeous locations that offer great food experiences then France should definitely be on your list, we talk here of the top 4 beautiful gastronomic destinations for the newly married where food is decadent and the bonus are the views

NICE IS NICE

Strolling through the shaded and winding streets of the old town to get a feel for the city's soul is one of the first things to do while visiting Nice. This district, with its tangle of narrow streets and brightly coloured façades, reflects the colours and style of Sardinian architecture. The Baroque's art and architecture, is also characterised through the religious patrimony deeply represented the Old Nice. Visit the Castel Hill, this park and its botanical garden offer a unique vista over Nice and its surroundings, magnificent panorama of the stunning sea with the old town in the foreground. The flowers and vegetable market of Nice is the most picturesque market in France and provides a feat for the eyes and a delight for the palate. Cours Saleya, which is one the most vibrant neighbourhoods of Nice, is the meeting point animated by its lively

cafés and restaurants; take time to admire the vibrant colours of magnificent flowers and get to know the local producers, which bring everyday a large choice of fruits and vegetables and local specialties is absolutely romantic for a foodie. The flower and vegetable market offers traditional items like the famous Pan Bagnat, literally 'moistened bread'. The sandwich is composed of a round white bread around the classic Salad Nicoise, a salad composed mainly of raw vegetables, hard boiled eggs, anchovies, and /or tuna, and olives. The Pissaladière, onion tart with olives and anchovies (pissalà means anchovy paste in Nissart). The famous - Socca, a large crepe of chickpea flour, to be eaten piping

hot and generously sprinkled with pepper. The Fougasse, Provencal bread stuffed with vegetables. Do not miss the 'Place Garibaldi Area', the Rue Bonaparte with the news, coffees and the stores! The Port of Nice built in a Genoese architectural style and situated at the foot of the Chateau hill is surrounded by yellow ochre houses, Located in the heart of the city, it is just a few minutes on foot from the city's main point of interest. But of course when you are in the most beautiful city of France you must indulge in a gorgeous coastal sightseeing tour of about an hour long, and allow yourself to be carried away on this charismatic maritime excursion from Cap de Nice to the Promenade des Anglais fleeting through the famed Villefranche bay.

Combining an exceptional historic heritage with a natural liking for good food, this second largest city of France and the capital of Rhone-Alpes region, Lyon has been the ultimate gastronomic city popular around the world owing to Chef Paul Bocuse. You can succumb here to the charm of the city's atmosphere, where everything is gourmandise, sometimes for the eyes and at other times for the taste buds. It boasts of over 2000 restaurants, including the famed 'bouchons' aka typical local eateries to Michelin star establishments. From traditional Lyonnaises (19th century cooks for the bourgeoisie) to creative

young chefs, Lyon is home to culinary experimentation with new tastes and concepts to be savoured. A must visit certainly is the 'Halles de Lyon-Paul Bocuse' which since its creation in 1859 have been an emblematic centre for Lyon gastronomy. As time went by the covered market turned into an existent market hall. This in turn fell into disorder to the point where in 1971 the new Halles De Lyon was built at its present location in the Part – Dieu neighbourhood. In December 2006, the 'Halles' went through yet another major turning point in their existence and after a complete face lift is now called 'Halles de Lyon-Paul Bocuse', in tribute to the great Lyon chef who frequently does his shopping here. Fifty six merchants and artisans share the market; amongst the renowned 'Mere Richard' (cheeses), sibila cooked meats etc. You can find all sorts of regional products here, all of exceptional quality, together with a number of restaurants and sea food joints. It's sheer amazement and inspiring to stroll around Lyon to admire its heritage and also to explore its many boutiques. All in all an ideal city for discovering all the charms and the French way of life!

STRASBOURG- A RICH HERITAGE

Built along the river Rhine, swaggering a 2000 year history and a town centre listed as UNESCO World Heritage, this eye-catching town combines convention with modernity and can be discovered on foot, by tram and even bicycle. Restaurants simply litter the streets of Strasbourg, some categorised amid the best in France. Genuine local specialities are best tasted in the 'winstub', Strasbourg's typical small family owned restaurants. A particularly rare phenomenon - the production of beer and wine side by side, needless to add in Alsace, both are of the ultimate quality. For example at Au Brasseur on 22 rue des Veaux, a very interesting a micro-brewery,

they create and brew their own beer and it is a great idea to wash down those home-made beers with 'tarte flambé' (flammekueche). With a tradition stretching back to 1260, Alsatian beer is universally recognised and enforces quality, consenting it to rival foreign beers. Foie Gras and Sauerkraut are the two centre pieces of Alsatian cuisine, but alongside these delicacies, many other mouthwatering dishes can be found on the menus. For example Baeckeoffe, and Spätzle which complement fish, in particular the famous matelote, poultry and game. For dessert after the sampling of the full flavoured Munster cheese appears a whole array of bilberry, plum and apple tarts. Not to forget the special cheese cake and the famous 'kougelhopf'. All of these gastronomical temptations can of course be done if accompanied by the precise wine. Although white wine dominates, the selection is enormous and intricate owing to the Alsatian tradition of labelling the wine by the name of the vine and not the place of origin and leads t o







multiple variations depending on the soil, aspect etc. Riesling, Pinot Blanc and Pinot noir these are just a few of them. A must try are also the colourless spirits of the region from Gewürztraminer Marc to the significant raspberry, the range is complete and boons a spectacular conclusion to a lavish meal. An area worth mentioning is 'The Petite France', formerly the fishermen, millers and tanners district, today is a peaceful tourist district in the heart of the town. The narrow streets offer a wealth of half-timbered houses dating from the 16th and 17th centuries, gigantic courtyards and huge sloping roofs. All in all, this capital of Alsace is rightly famous for its delicious cuisine, wine and beer.





Europe: The Orient Express

The Orient Express began its maiden voyage on 4 October 1883 at the Gare de Strasbourg (Today's Gare de l'Est) in the presence of high-ranking politicians, journalists and writers. Despite the enthusiastic press coverage of that first journey, it was not until 1 June 1889 that the luxury sleeping-car service began operating a direct link to Constantinople, eliminating the need to change trains or take a steamer across the Bosphorus.


A timeless emblem of the Art of Travel, the Orient Express carried many notable celebrities, including American actress Marlene Dietrich, the adventurer Lawrence of Arabia, King Ferdinand of Bulgaria, Russian novelist Leo Tolstoy, and even spies such as the infamous Mata Hari. The mythical status of the Orient Express was further enhanced by books and films – most famously, Agatha Christie's Murder on the Orient Express, and the adventures of James Bond.

More trains were soon added to the service, all equally luxurious, to keep up with demand. 24 hours in Kuala Lumpur

uala Lumpur is once again in the limelight with the IIFA, a popular film award show being hosted there in June. If you are one of the many Hindi movie aficionados and headed to Malaysia next month, here's a quick guide to explore KL amidst rubbing shoulders with the Bollywood glitterati.

Make sure you have a heavy breakfast, apply ample sunscreen, pack a bottle of water and head out for a fun-filled day ahead

9 am

Amid the many family-oriented attractions set within the vast British legacy of Lake Gardens, none compare to hands-on fun to what's billed as the 'world's largest free-flight walk-in aviary', 'KL Bird Park'. Here you can chase peacocks and hornbills, pose with owls and parrots on one's shoulder, feed parakeets, watch ostriches lay eggs and be awed by soaring storks and flamingoes in surroundings that hardly feel caged-in or too commercial.

Mid morning

Head to visit to The Merdeka Square, a historical site where Malaysia declared its Independence. The Union Flag was lowered and the Malayan flag was raised for the very first time at the stroke of midnight of 31st August 1957

hosted there from 5th-7th June"

The flagpole which holds the flag of Malaysia is the highest in the world, towering at a height of 100 meters. Spend some time here visiting the National History Museum and the adjoining Kuala Lumpur City Gallery.

Around noon

Thread your way through the stalls and choose a meal from whichever eatery takes your fancy; or, for something a little classier, sample Nyonya cuisine, a fusion of Chinese and Malay traditions and not to forget quaint souvenirs for those back home.

Around 9 pm

Grab a typical Malay dinner at Jalan Alor, KL's most characterful eating street. The place is brimming with dozens of Chinese restaurants and food stalls. Don't miss its array of massage centres, with services from traditional Chinese tui na – pressure-point massage – to the classiest of Western-style day-spa treatments.

Considering a day well spent, treat yourself to a reflexology foot massage. •

This festive day is celebrated by catholics and dedicated to St. John the Baptist. According to the festival's longstanding traditions, the local youth of Goa jump into wells to retrieve the gifts that have been thrown inside by villagers. Later on, to mark the end of the day and pay tribute to the rains, they feast on an abundance of meat and seafood.

On the other hand, the feast of St. Peter. also known as Sangodd, is a monsoonbased celebration by Goa's local fishing community. Their boats are tied together to form rafts, which serve as makeshift stages. On these stages are erected miniature models of chapels or churches. Tiatrs (local drama theatre), music and folk dances are performed before an audience watching from the riverbanks.

Another festival - Bonderam is celebrated on August 24: it is local to the quaint island of Divar, away from the hustle and bustle of the capital city. In remembrance of old territorial battles that took place on the island, mock skirmishes are re-enacted by boys and girls wielding fotashes (toy flags made with bamboo) and using berries for missiles. Soothing music is played in the village throughout the day, and the crowd grows as the day progresses. Parade floats are a highlight of this festival, where colours come alive along with the costumes.

Another happening event is the Chikalkalo. People celebrate Chikalkalo, a traditional festival, at Marcel, Goa, It is an annual traditional event in which people of Marcel village take part after the 'Ashadi Ekadashi'.

Perfect for trekking and eco adventure



elcome to Chef Sujan S's laboratory that follows two simple rules - 1. Come with an open heart, 2. There is no rule when it comes to cooking. Be prepared to taste ingredients that you might have never known of, dishes that might be deceptive in appearance, tiny portions that explode in the mouth. This is where one gets to witness the marriage between global cuisine and local ingredients –From the regions of Jammu & Kashmir, Tamil Nadu, coastal Gujarat, West Bengal, Coorg and Godda (Jharkhand).

Chef Sujan wanted to showcase the diversity of produce through India and discover regional techniques and thus set out on a journey to explore and experiment. A relentless search for local farmers, fishermen and butchers, that lasted several months as good taste comes from good produce. In Udhampur, in J&K, he discovered fermented Kalari cheese (fermented cheese) which is traditionally pan seared and treated like Haloumi cheese, which is served at the Tasting Lab with salsify cooked in creamy gucchi (morel mushroom) sauce, sprinkled

with Kashmiri walnuts theca crumb. In Atreyapuram, Andhra Pradesh, the making of Pootharkelu (Rice Paper) was discovered, which involves coating a hot pot with a thin paste of rice batter that results in extremely thin paper like sheet. Other ingredients from the journey include Gandharaj Lime (variety of lime found in West Bengal), Salicornia (harvested in Gujarat), Cassava and other Roots (Chennai and West Bengal) and a lot many other interesting products.

Chef Sujan and his team - Development chef Achintya and Sous chef Dhruv Oberoi welcome you to taste these incredible creations at The Tasting Lab at Olive Qutub in a sit down, no rule, 9 course meal showcasing European cuisine with world influences and produce and ingredients sourced from all over India. But remember what was said at the very beginning—come with an open heart! This may not go well with the lovers of butter chicken and hakka noodles, but is what is needed to take Delhi up a notch on the Global gastromony scene.

Tamra's interactive kitchens are a tribute to the early market place, here you can interact with the chefs and customise vour food too.

Cool interiors

Conceptualised by the renowned Dubai based Stickman Design, the restaurant is a visual depiction of culinary delights from around the world. The design element is rustic with all the rolling pins hanging to form a partition, yet it has a quirky feel to it.

From the wheat grass lined planter boxes that form the backdrop to the continental station, the leather strapped rolling pin canopy, rustic slated timber on the Japanese, Asian and Indian counter bulkheads are paired with contemporary colourful tiles that gives the space an overall warm character. Copper hanging pots are displayed over the two infinity tables where mirrored walls provide an exaggerated view. Designed with intimacy in mind, Tamra has pockets of privacy screened off by decorative floor




Bakery

From Bakirkhani (puff pastry) to lavaas (thin naan like bread), tsot (a round loaf of bread topped with poppy and sesame seeds), krip (biscuit like bread) to delicious pound cakes, tea is an elaborate affair in Kashmir, it involves an array of non vegetarian snacks as well, but the bakery products surpass it all. Try Hatrick in Rajbagh for fudge, Mughal Darbar for cake, Sopore, Downtown and Khanyaar areas for the breads. All bakeries in Srinagar open early, and the goods are often sold out by midday. Accompany these delicious nibbles with a hot cup of noon chai/ sheer (salted tea), a local specialty.

Wazwaan

On special occasions like weddings, an elaborate meal of 36 dishes is prepared. Preparing it is a a laborious task as certain dishes require one or more days to prep for. Main dishes include rista(Pounding meat meatballs in red sauce), tabakhmaaz (ribs) and Gushtaba— large meatballs served in yoghurt. These are accompanied by rice, curd,


- Keep dry fruits handy. These are nutritious and will comfort you when hungry. A few almonds, walnuts, cashew nuts, dates and figs are ideal.

Using simple, but effecting yoga asanas, you will learn to empower yourself to manifest the changes you want in your life.

When you are practising partner yoga, an energetic cord extends from your energy body to your partner. Likewise, when they are with you, an energy cord extends from them to you. When you love another person with your heart, you send out an energetic cord from your heart to their heart. This love empowers both of you. It feels intimate, permissive and non- judgmental. While you support your partner in his or her asanas, you feel loved thighs. and supported by that love.

You connect with your partner while practising the asanas by being gentler with yourself, by being more compassionate with yourself and being kind while assisting your partner, so as you inhale, he exhales; as

By doing partner yoga you will find in yourself that deep love for yourself and your partner. You will start to notice how you are rewarded as you begin these new loving

habits. Not only will you feel better about yourself and your life, but your partner will begin to behave differently to you as well.

VARIOUS POSES FOR COUPLES

Partner Breathing

With your back resting against your partner, spine touching, sit in an easy cross legged position, resting your hands on your

Allow yourself to feel and connect with your partner through inhalations and exhalations of the breath.

Start to breathe alternately with your he inhales, you exhale. Practice for three

This is a gentle way to connect with your partner, helps open the heart and is an easy way to connect with your breath.



Partner Twist

Start in a seated position with legs crossed and your spines touching each other.

Inhale with your arms over the head holding each others hands or wrist and start to lengthen the spine.

Exhale and twist to the right, bringing your right hand to the inside of your partner's left knee and your left hand to the outside of your right knee/thigh. Your partner should mirror the movement

Hold for five breaths, then exhale, untwist and repeat on the opposite side.

Twists help cleanse the body and assist in the detoxifying process. This is also a fun way to initiate playfulness with your partner.

Twin Trees

Begin by standing a few feet apart with your partner facing the same direction.

Bring palms toward each other with the arms in a T shape, or draw the elbows and palms together in a cactus shape.

Begin to shift the weight onto your right foot and draw the left leg into tree pose by bending the knee and bringing foot to the ankle, calf or inner thigh of the standing leg.

Your partner will shift the weight onto his or her left foot and bring the right foot to the





ankle, calf or inner thigh.

Help to balance each other for five breaths, then release and turn around to face the opposite direction and repeat on the opposite

Down dog/ back bend

Begin with your partner in downward facing dog.

Then to take your partner deeper in their stretch place your feet in between the partner's hands and lower yourself onto your partners back.

Then stretch your arms overhead and give yourself a lovely backbend here.

Stay for several breaths and swap places.

Partner forward fold

Sit opposite each other with your legs extended in a V-shape.

Bring the soles of your feet together, extend your arms toward each other, hold opposite arm to palm.

Temple Pose

Once your hands touch with your partner, keep folding forward bringing forearms and hands to rest against each other.

Rest your weight against each other and release your chest and belly.

Hold for five breaths.

Boat Pose

Start with sitting on opposite sides of the mat and join the legs together by holding the hands outside your hips.

Keeping your spine straight, raise your legs and let your hands go. ◆



beach escape may be the ideal destination for a summer honeymoon—the sun, sand and the sea make for a befitting backdrop for some fun and romance. But before zipping off to your perfect summer get away, you must not forget to consider two factors that may act as eventual downers for your skin. These include exposure to UV rays and coarse salt. Prolonged exposure to high UV index rays can cause tanning of the skin, skin burns and also contributes to premature ageing of the skin. High salt content of sea water tends to dehydrate the skin and make it look parched and wrinkled.

The C-T-M routine: Follow a cleansing, toning, moisturising routine and moisturise the skin before bed with a gentle soothing moisturiser. This allows the skin to heal and renew during the

Ensure UV protection: Water resistant sunscreens are available which are effective for up to an hour while in the water. A broad brimmed hat and sunglasses are the best for additional sun protection. It is also advisable to try and stay under a beach umbrella or gazebo during the peak sun hours from 10 am-3 pm when the UV index is at its peak.

Rinse and dry: It is best to wash off the salt water as soon as practically • I feasible as salt on the skin can cause dehydration, cuts and abrasions.

Keep your lips soft and supple: A lip balm with SPF should be used all through the day.

Keep your skin and body regularly hydrated: Dehydration is a big issue due to the high salt content. It is advisable to keep sipping on cold water or fresh fruit juices while at the beach. It is better to avoid alcohol as that can cause further dehydration.

REVITALISING YOUR SKIN POST THE VACATION:

Never break away from the **C-T-M routine:** Continue with regular cleansing, toning, moisturising routine. Although one is back from the beach, a sunscreen should be used regularly to protect the skin from the high UV index.

Don't be the doc, visit one: If you have come back with a sunburn, it is advisable to see a dermatologist. They will be able to prescribe creams to cut down the inflammation early so that there is no chance of the skin healing with pigmentation.

Home spun masks: A face pack containing anything sour in the kitchen like voghurt, vinegar or lime juice may be used in combination with gram flour, sandalwood powder or fullers earth. The acidic nature of the sour ingredient works as a natural peel and helps take the tan away.

The same pack can be applied on arms, legs, hands and feet to get rid of the tan naturally and gently.

Know your skin and avoid certain skin treatments: Some skin treatments like LASERs have a high complication rate when performed on tanned skin. These treatments should be avoided until the tan subsides. Treatments like a mild chemical peel, a photofacial or microdermabrasion can help reduce the tan and may be recommended by the dermatologist.

S t e r i l i s e the skin: A • Jentle soothing moisturiser should be applied generously all over the face and the body. This will help in skin healing. A urea based moisturiser can help keep the feet, elbows and knuckles soft and well hydrated. Lipbalm should be used regularly and a gentle lip scrub may be used beforehand to take away any dead cells. Some people have a tendency to develop a burn on the lip. If this is the case, then a dermatologist should be consulted who may prescribe some steroid or

anti-inflammatory cream. **Hydration is the key:** Drink plenty of clear oral fluids like water, coconut water etc to keep the body hydrated and cool.

Colour your diet: Eat plenty of brightly coloured fresh fruits and vegetables. The high dose of anti-oxidants will promote healing of the

Detox: Most people would have had excess alcohol during the holidays. It is better to avoid alcohol and let the body detox for a week to ten days.

Sweat it out to glow: An active healthy lifestyle of exercising regularly and getting adequate rest at night will help the mind stay relaxed and will help the skin to heal.





The three days saw a series of press conferences, B2B exchanges, and dialogues that will have a long and lasting impact on tourism in the state.



events like these, "In future, we will fix a particular date for organising this event so that international buyers can plan their trip accordingly," he said.


"We need these kinds of events in Kashmir in which buyers across the world visit and do business with locals here. It will not only help tourism but also give business to local players," he said.

He further added, "Srinagar is the goldmine of unexplored heritage tourism where age old shrines of Sufi saints are existing in their original form. But unfortunately, so far it has not been fully tapped and brought onto the tourism map."



iovernment will soon privatise eight loss-making hotels run by India Tourism Development Corporation (ITDC) as it plans to 'offload' all the sick units, Mahesh Sharma, tourism minister said. "We propose that all our sick units need to be offloaded. Out of 16 hotels, eight are in very bad shape and we propose to disinvest it in the very first phase. It is not wise to bear the burden of these loss-making units,"


> "The ball has started rolling," he said, adding that the formal process should begin within two months. However, he ruled out the possibility of selling off The Ashok, the flagship property of ITDC in the capital, "Ashok will not be on the block. We are trying to revamp it and this year we will make it a profitable venture," the tourism minister said.

The eight hotels which are likely to go under the hammer include those at Jaipur, Bhubaneswar, Puri, Jammu, Guwahati, Ranchi, Pondicherry and the Lalitha Mahal hotel in Mysore, all of which are loss-making. The minister said whether the privatisation will be through joint venture or giving the operation and management to private players on a lease or any other modes was yet to be decided.
